Top 5 Coastal Management Challenges

- Deteriorating ecosystems leading to reduced (environmental, recreational, economic, storm buffer) functionality,
- Increasing storminess due to <u>climate change</u> (i.e., more frequent and intense impacts),
- <u>Coastal Flooding</u>, both
 - Sea level rise and associated flooding (e.g., nuisance flooding, King tides), and
 - Combined effects of rainfall and surge on urban flooding (i.e., episodic, short-term),
- Chronic beach erosion (i.e., high/increasing long-term erosion rates), and
- Coastal <u>water quality</u>, including Harmful Algal Blooms (e.g., red tide, sargassum).



Top Coastal Management Challenge: Water Quality








User Assessment of USGS and ASBPA Coastal Tools










National Assessment of State Sediment Placement Regulations


